Context

At Sha'arei Tsedek North London Synagogue, we pride ourselves on being a warm, diverse and welcoming community. We welcome all who seek a connection to Jewish life regardless of religious background or beliefs, gender, sexual orientation, race, ethnicity, socio-economic status, age, or abilities.

Our Synagogue choir is made up of volunteer members of the synagogue. There is a familial, friendly atmosphere among the singers. As well as aiming to make a great sound musically, we all try to have a good time doing it.

The choir sing at all B'nei Mitzvah services; and once a month on a Shabbat when there is no B'nei Mitzvah in that particular month.

During the Days of Awe the choir sing at all services from the beautiful Choral Selichot service through Rosh Hashanah culminating with Kol Nidre and Yom Kippur.
