Sukkat Shalom Reform Synagogue is a member of the Movement for Reform Judaism and is based in Wanstead London E11 1UL. Our synagogue is over 40 years old and is housed in a beautiful Grade 2 listed building that was once part of the old Wanstead hospital complex and prior to that the Merchant Seamans Orphans Home.

We are a growing community of over 475 Full Members and Associate Members, plus around 90 children, most of whom live in East London and Essex. Our Rabbi is Tali Artman Partock, who is also a lecturer at Cambridge University and the Leo Baeck College. We have close links with other local synagogues, Oaks Lane and Woodford Progressive and hold a number of joint services with them.

Our small friendly cheder has about 15 children aged from 6 to 13 split into two classes and runs on a Saturday morning from 9am to 12 noon. The older class runs from 9am to 11am following which the children join their parents in the service. The younger class runs from 9.30am to 12 noon. The children learn Hebrew for part of the morning and Jewish studies including Bible, festivals, history, rituals and ethics for the rest of the morning. There is also a teaching assistant (who was a pupil at the cheder) to help with the younger class.

We are looking for an enthusiastic person to teach the younger class (ages 6 to 10) and to act as headteacher/co-ordinator.

Responsibilities

- **1.** Liaise with the Rabbi and Teachers to plan a scheme of work and lesson plans relevant to the content required. Have regular communication with Chair of Education regarding running of Cheder.
- 2. To teach the younger class Hebrew and Jewish studies.
- **3.** Actively engage with the madrichimot (assistant teachers) encouraging their interaction with the students and encouraging their own personal development.
- **4.** Engage with cheder parents informing them of cheder activities and dates as well as student progress.
- **5.** Maintain student records and ensure health and safety records are kept up to date.
- **6.** Help to ensure a welcoming environment for students.
